Tampa 2019


Sunday, March 3:

So ... the first internship trip of 2019 Fire Observers vzw has started. Mario and Robby guide 8 Fire Observers during the internship at the fire department of Tampa, Florida. I left very early today and the atmosphere was right there. When picking up Sammy Blommaert, no light is detected. His brother David Blommaert was called hard a few times, but no answer. When he finally realized that he was pressing the wrong bell, the damage had already been done. Fortunately for David, no one came to open the door at the wrong house. His brother opened the door after the first bell. And we just laugh ... Then on to Zaventem, where the group was ready on time at the agreed place. Quickly done baggage drop and then another coffee together with Carl Verstrepen who came to wave us goodbye. Everyone went through customs smoothly and not much later we flew to Amsterdam. We had to wait a while for our connecting flight and at 2.40 pm the Boeing 767 went from Delta to USA, more specifically Orlando, Florida.





After flying for 10 hours we arrived in the US. Everything went very smoothly there and less than 30 minutes later we already had our rental cars. Just playing Tertris with the suitcases, but no problem we got everything in the car. For our hotel we had to drive a 28km, but then the GPS must be on 1 line with the driver, with the result that our 2nd companion arrived 20 minutes later at the hotel (local time 9 pm). Just check in and put our luggage in the room and then have a bite to eat. The choice was quickly made ... Hooters. We ate and drank well and at 11.45 pm we went to sleep. Tomorrow another busy day ahead of colleagues at the Tampa fire department.



Monday, March 4:

After our first night in Orlando in which many of us got up early, we will have breakfast at Denny's where we let ourselves be stuffed with a hearty American breakfast. Full and satisfied we left on time. we were received by Chief Locicero and Jason Penny with whom we made the contacts. After a brief briefing and explanation of the Tampa Firedepartment, we had a Quick tour around headquarters and Firestation 1 The Big house. After the visit to HQ we went to arrange some last things at a local Wal-Mart and we dropped the men off at their assigned stations. We were warmly welcomed about all the places we visited and we were given a tour in the station, eventually we were talking to one of the firefighters and he also knew someone who came from Holland Fabio, and yes the world is small Fabio from Hulst whom we well know. After we dropped everyone off, Mario and Giovanni went back to their station # 1. And where we didn't have to wait long for the first call a working fire on which several of our group went, so that promises something for the coming week. Tomorrow Tuesday 5 March we will visit the training center where we will see a few demonstrations.



Tuesday, March 5th:

Today we had a tour of the Training facility there, although it is called The Sunny State, we unfortunately had some rain today, but that didn't spoil the fun and a nice program was put in for us inside.

We had quite a bit of insight into the American way and in many aspects it is very similar to how we are doing in Europe, after a short break for lunch where we had a delicious Cuban Sandwich, the program started again.







Wednesday, March 6:

Today the Fireboat is on the program.

Arrived at the port we were received by the duty station that manned those boats during an exit. Captain Bogush gave us a tour on Fireboat 1 The Patriot, he gave us a detailed explanation of how the Patriot worked and what it is used for.

After the tour, the Patriot was prepared to make a tour of the Tampa Bay.

First they sailed to Down Town where the maneuverability and extinguishing capacity etc. of the Patriot was demonstrated, this was for many impressive and beautiful to see, after this demonstration a course was set for Tampa Bay where of course the power of the Patriot was shown.

The tour was again closed with the handing out of the necessary Gifts as a thank you on behalf of the Fireobservers.





Thursday, March 7:

Today the visit is planned at the airport service ARFF of Tampa International Airport. The ARFF is manned by station 2 and its crew, we were warmly welcomed by the Chief, we got a nice presentation of the facility and what the ARFF stands for and afterwards were shown around by the facility that looked great, and many of us european where jealous of the equipment.



After the tour we were allowed to go to the garage where of course the crash tenders are, they even have 4 here and it is always great to see these machines.

After they were all put outside, we got a nice explanation from the Captain how they work and how they are used during an intervention.

Of course we all had the opportunity to drive and a nice demo was given of the capacity of these vehicles, always impressive to experience.





After this beautiful morning, we closed with the necessary thanks and we all received beautiful souvenirs as a memento.



After a nice informative explanation of how 911 works and the necessary information about the number of calls they have on an annual basis, we were given a tour with the men and women of Dispatch themselves.

Here we were assisted by Janet and we received a wonderful explanation about the daily life of a dispacther and what they already do during a service.

We were then given the opportunity to listen to the 4 dispatchers on duty and we were given an impression of what they should do during a call.





After the visit it was time for lunch, since the men have not yet been to a Firehouse sub, the choice was quickly made.





Saturday 9 and Sunday 10 March:

These two days were all about 48 station time.

These days were freely arranged by everyone, some had arranged tickets for Bush Garden and they were eagerly used.

Others stayed at the barracks to make the necessary calls and to spend more time with the crew.







Monday, March 11:

Today the last day full day in Tampa, because from tomorrow the tourist program is on it. This afternoon we will all be welcomed at HQ where we will officially say goodbye to the Tampa Fire Department.



For the official part, it was quickly arranged that the fire department store that was normally closed was just opened because apparently there was more demand for T-shirts etc. So that 3rd suitcase is probably full now. I can proudly say that everyone enjoyed it immensely and received a lot from the working method in the United States and of course made many new friends, therefore a big thank you to the men and women of the Tampa Firedepartment and the facilitators of all this (because being a supervisor is a difficult and tiring task of course) to make this possible. At Headquarters we were welcomed by our first contact person, Chief Locicero and Jason Penny, for these gentlemen, of course, gifts were brought from Belgium and the Netherlands. For all there was also a Certificate on behalf of the Fire department of participation in the internship, which was issued by Chief Locicero himself.


All in all, we can already speak of a very successful internship at the Tampa Firedepartment.

Some of us were allowed to go into the books for a test before skiing, otherwise they were not allowed to come. Probably an unreliable face




First we enjoy the evening hours on Key West, where various street artists show their skills during sunset.






Tuesday, March 19:
